

COMPENDIO DE DATOS EN MATERIA DE BÚSQUEDA Y RESCATE DE SANTA LUCIA In October 2018, the XII CDMA meeting was convened in Trinidad and Tobago. The Ministers of Defense discussed and agreed there should be ad hoc Groups organized by different member states to discuss hemisphere topics of mutual interest, to include the development of mechanisms of cooperation and coordination on Search and Rescue. The Ad Hoc group met from 08 to 12 April, 2018 in Mexico City and discussed the possibility of implementing a SAR data collection/compendium instrument to collate information which could be shared amongst Member States in relation to the Search and Rescue systems and structures currently in existence. This instrument can be utilized to strengthen existing relationships and mechanisms in order to enhance cooperation and coordination on Search and Rescue in the Region. # 2. SEARCH AND RESCUE COORDINATING CENTERS.

#### a. Urban Search and Rescue.

Saint Lucia Fire Service has primary responsibility for Urban SAR. The Fire Service Personnel are assisted by Police Officers from the Special Services Unit upon request.

- LOCATION: Manoel Street, Castries Saint Lucia.
- CAPACITIES:\_Fully equipped and trained for Water Rescue. Limited training and equipment for USAR.

### b. Sea Sar.

Police Marine Unit has primary responsibility.

- **SCOPE:** Northern and Southern Divisions. Any CARICOM Member State once there is a request for assistance.
- LOCATION: Vigie, Castries, Saint Lucia.
- CAPACITY: 8 vessels.

## c. Martinique Rescue Coordination Center (MRCCSEA SAR).

Provides coordination assistance to the Police Marine Unit as well as Maritime and Air support for SAR purposes.

- SCOPE: 100 nautical miles and as far north as Guadeloupe and as far south as St. Vincent and the Grenadines with coordination from MRCC.

Provides support on request. RSS also provides ground support by mobilizing the CARICOM Disaster Relief Unit and LSAR Teams to Member States on request. Teams are equipped with a COMMS PACK and USAR equipment.

#### 5. SEARCH AND RESCUE MEANS

- a. MARITIME (8 vessels 65 feet Patrol Boat, two 33 feet RHIB, two 27 feet Brunswicks, 27 feet P. O. 3, 40 feet P O 4, 27 feet Mako, 7 meter RHIB. Fire Service fully equipped with Water Rescue gear.
- b. AIR SUPPORT from RSS Airwing (2 planes) and MRCC.
- c. **GROUND** Fire Service has limited USAR equipment. Current equipment available: rescue rope, rescue baskets, wheel barrows, crow bars, sledge hammers, shovels, pick axes.

  - Incoming personnel fall under the command of Lead local Authority.
